Bedford Fields Community Forest Garden

This is an open access garden in Woodhouse, LS6, that aims to educate people on how forest gardening and edible landscaping can be a viable alternative to food production, resilient to climactic and social change. We educate volunteers and the local community about forest gardening and wider environmental issues through workdays, workshops and discussion.

We believe in bringing rural life to the city. With about an acre of land in total, we have over 80 species of edible plants and a mixed species hedge planted and fenced off as a wildlife corridor leading to Woodhouse ridge.


